

Fast (hide), seek (read & pray), share (talk, text, proclaim)

Our boxes were processed on December 6th, 2021 and sent on their way to Ukraine. The journey has just begun so now is the time to fast and pray especially for these boxes. (Remember, it can take months for boxes to get through customs and to their final distribution location).

Monday Jan. 10th: today use A.C.T.S. as your prayer outline. Adoration, Confession, Thanksgiving, Service. Pray: Lord you are...\_\_, Father forgive me..., God thank you...

Tuesday Jan. 11th: today's Bible reading is Job 40-42. As you read the chapters, think about how you can pray the scripture for people in Ukraine and then pray that scripture for them. Example: Job 41:11 the sovereign God, creator/sustainer

Wednesday Jan. 12th: Read the info about Ukraine and allow God to direct your prayers for the Ukrainian people.

Thursday Jan. 13th: Pray: Lord, give me a hunger for your word. A desire to know more about you. All my hope is in you Lord Jesus. Thank you for the peace you have given to me, which does not depend on feelings or circumstances.

Friday Jan. 14th: the memory verses for this week are Hebrews 11:6, 8-10. Pray these verses for you and someone you know. "Diligently seek Him."

Saturday Jan. 15th: Pray: Lord may your love, grace, and mercy abound in my life. Heavenly father, may I increase in faith and knowledge of you. Thank you for the redemptive work of the cross.

Some info on Ukraine:

Ukraine has a population of approximately 41 million with 87% identifying as Christian. That means there are about 5.3 million that need the good news. It is one of the world's largest grain exporters, and is sometimes called the "Breadbasket of Europe". However, the country is one of the poorest in Europe and is also among the most severely corrupt in the continent.

The armed conflict in eastern Ukraine continues to take a high toll on civilians, from threatening their physical safety to limiting access to food, medicines, adequate housing, and schools. Pray for peace in the midst of the conflict.
